

Memorandum of Understanding By and Between Cascadia College and CCCFT Regarding Class Limits

This memorandum of understanding (MOU) is between Cascadia College, District 30 and the Cascadia Community College Federation of Teachers (CCCFT).

Whereas the College and CCCFT share a mutual interest in following class limits that have been established in order to maintain the optimum teaching and learning environment, therefore, Article 8: WORKLOAD AND FACULTY RESPONSIBILITIES, and more specifically, Article 8.07, addressing Class Limits, shall be modified as follows:

8.07 Class Limits

The following class limits have been established in order to maintain the optimum teaching and learning environment. Faculty may overload their classes at their discretion. Deviation from these class limits can be made by mutual agreement. Classes that are offered both via elearning mode and face-to-face shall use the class caps as listed below:

Descriptor	Course Capacity
Directed interactive learning courses (lecture)	33
Non-lab science and art classes, language classes, Math below 100, ELP, ABE, ESL	30
Public Speaking (CMST& 220 and CMST&101)	28
Laboratory Courses including art and drama lab classes, DRMA151/152/153, Creative Writing (ENG 235, 271, 274, 277, 279), English 102 and below	24
Learning communities (10 Credit)	48
Learning Communities (15 Credit)	72

This MOU is a mutual agreement that CMST&101 shall have its limit reduced from 33 to 28.

The MOU is subject to ratification by CCCFT and approval by the College President and shall be effective....
